Literacy

- Challenge low phonological and language abilities in the Foundation Stage.
- Challenge lower comprehension skills in non-fiction texts compared to fiction.
- Continue to utilise and assess the effectiveness of interventions.

83% of children who used the Lexia Literacy program and 93% of children who used the Nessy Spelling program improved their PTE scores this year.

Pastoral care, Safeguarding and Wellbeing

- Safeguarding Policies and Procedures audit to take place.
- Whole School Pastoral care initiatives organised including Anti-Bullying Week activities, Children's Mental health week and Internet Safety awareness including E-safety Day.

ICT

- To utilise Just2easy throughout the school in order to aid the delivery of ICT.

- Purchase additional I-pads to aid the teaching of ICT.
